¹ "The harmony of his Being is the result not of a perfect balance of parts but of the absence of parts. Between His attributes no contradiction can exist. He need not suspend one to exercise another, for in Him all His attributes are one. All of God does all that God does; He does not divide Himself to perform a work, but works in the total unity of His being." (AW Tozer, <u>Knowledge of the Holy</u>, 15)

God is Immutable (Unchanging)

Definition: "God is unchanging in his being, perfections, purposes, and promises, yet God does act and feel emotions, and he acts and feels differently in response to different situations."

Unchanging Being (see also Mal. 3:6-7, 2 Tim. 2:13, Heb. 13:8, James 1:17)

• Ps. 102:25-27

Unchanging Purposes

- Ps. 33:11 The counsel of the LORD stands for ever, the thoughts of his heart to all generations.
- Is. 46:8-11 "Remember this and stand firm, recall it to mind, you transgressors, remember the former things of old; for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done, saying, 'My counsel shall stand, and I will accomplish all my purpose,' calling a bird of prey from the east, the man of my counsel from a far country. I have spoken, and I will bring it to pass; I have purposed, and I will do it."

Unchanging Promises (see also 2 Sam. 22:31, Is. 14:27, Deut. 7:9-11)

• Heb. 6:13-18

But what about ...?

- ...when God "changed" His mind (Ex. 32:9-14, Is. 38:1-6, Jonah 3:4, 10)
- ...when God is "sorry" or "regrets" something (Gen. 6:6, 1 Sam. 15:10)
- 1. God feels. (Is. 62:5, Ps. 78:40/ Eph. 4:30, Ex. 32:10, Ps. 103:17)
- 2. God is personal and responds to different situations differently.
- 3. God uses language that we can relate to / understand (anthropomorphic).
- 4. God wants to highlight his redemptive purposes.

³ "When a single attribute is chosen as foundational it affects the total portrait of God; a wrong choice here points us to a different God than the one revealed in Scripture. Choosing love, for example, exposes to the danger of regarding other attributes of God, such as righteousness and holiness, as less real." (Herman Bavinck, *Reformed Dogmatics*-Abridged, p. 176)

- **4.** Spend time dwelling on the permanence of God by spending time in a world that reflects both His steadiness and how creatures constantly change. Read, reflect and pray one of the following Psalms: 89, 46, 90 or 85.
- **5.** What human relationship, possession or circumstance do you cling to for stability instead of to our unchanging God? How reliable have you found that substitute "rock" to be?
- **6.** Spend time praising God for all the ways that He hasn't changed and all the ways that He has helped you to change.

Like the tallest mountain peak on the horizon, from generation to generation, God stands unchanging, immutable, anchoring the landscape of human existence as all else around him ebbs and flows, blossoms and withers, waxes and wanes. The Rock of our salvation endures. The sunshine and shadows of human circumstance may reveal different contours of his character one day and different ones the next, but his character remains fixed. His plans remain steady. His promises remain firm. In an everchanging world, he is the unchanging reference point upon which the inner eye fixes to determine the direction that leads home."
