I PROJECT DETAILS

What are the goals of the project?

Our desire is to see each team member grow in loving and living Jesus Christ by:

1. *Studying* what the Bible says about evangelism
2. *Communicating* the gospel to others
3. *Leading* others towards Christ

When are applications due?

Applications are due by Sunday, April 8, 2018. We will be reviewing applications as they come in and will notify you within a week of receiving your application.

When and where is The Ignite Project happening?

The Ignite Project will be happening April 27-28, 2018 at Glenwood.

Here is a rough schedule:

Friday 4:00 - 9:30pm
Saturday 9:00am - 8:00pm

When are the training meetings?

There are two *required* training meetings on the following Sunday afternoons at the House at Glenwood:

- April 15, from 12:00 – 3:00 pm
- April 22, from 12:00 – 3:00 pm

Please remember to bring a lunch and your Bible to each meeting.

What will we be doing?

We have some exciting things planned for the project, all designed to accomplish our three goals of studying, communicating, and leading! Look forward to hearing more details at our first training meeting (April 15).

- Game & Dessert Night with the older adults of Glenwood
- Planning and leading a middle school youth group-like event for unbelieving friends
- Devoting specific time each day to reading and discussing the Bible
- Praying for one another and for other

How much does the project cost?

Each team member will need to contribute \$40 for The Ignite Project. The money is due by the final training meeting (April 22).

How can I pay for the project?

Our recommendation is that students and parents discuss a strategy that works best for their family. Parents could pay for all, part, or none of the project. Students could use saved-up money, do chores around the house, or offer help to neighbors and friends (babysitting, mowing the yard, pulling weeds, etc.). There are many possibilities that can be explored!

What homework will we have for the project?

Each team member will have homework before The Ignite Project week. But don't worry, this isn't head-scratching math! This homework is meant to help you grow and is not as hard as you might think! The following homework will be explained in more detail at the first training meeting on April 15.

- Praying for all fellow team members and those we will be influencing.
- Inviting 3 unbelieving friends to the IGNITE event at Glenwood on Saturday, April 28.
- Writing a personal letter to an unbelieving friend.

Are you concerned you don't have 3 unbelieving friends? That is ok! We will talk about it at our first training meeting on April 15.
