On May 1st, eleven students visited Bassin Zim, one of the little known treasures of Haiti. Located about three hours from Port-au-Prince, Bassin Zim sits along the Central Plateau and contains waterfalls, coves and caves.

On their trip, Johny took the opportunity to teach from 2 Timothy 2:1-24, using the theme "Your conduct may contribute to your success or to your failure." He encouraged the students to



analyze their behavior and conduct in light of Scripture as they grow spiritually, physically, and intellectually. The hope of Johny, Rosadite and all the staff at CENV is that God will increase the desire of students to look



Cooking – Haitian Style

The recipe below is quick and easy and will give you an idea of what you might have for dessert if you were visiting or living in Haiti. Please ask your parents for help before you use the stove. Have fun!

Du Riz au Lait (rice pudding)

Ingredients:

8 cups of water

1 cup of long grain rice

1 cinnamon stick

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 tsp of lemon zest

1 tsp of fresh ginger, grated

1 can of condensed milk

2 tsp of almond extract

1 cup of raisins

In a medium saucepan, combine water, rice, cinnamon stick, lemon zest, salt, and freshly grated ginger. Bring to a boil. Cook over high heat until water is absorbed. Reduce heat. Stir in the milk, raisins, and almond extract. Enjoy!
