God's wisdom in redemption. 1 Corinthians 1:21-25, 2:7-8

God's wisdom in Christ. Colossians 2:2b-3

## Application / Implication:

1. Class...
2. Worship / Adoration.
3. God knows us perfectly - leading to fear (unsaved) or confession / comfort (saved).
4. Confess / repent coveting divine knowledge - trying to outsmart, bargain with, or fool God.
5. Ask him for wisdom.

6. Where does wisdom come from? What steps must we take to lay hold of this gift?
7. How does the fact of God's All-Knowing and All-Wise comfort you personally? How does it expand your amazement at divine grace?
