The Prophet's Complaint (v. 2-4)

Likely Historical Backdrop of Habakkuk (609-605 BC; 2 Kings 22-23)

- Invasions of Israel/Judah Assyria (722 BC), Babylon (586 BC)
- Josiah reigned in Judah from (640-609 BC).
- Jehoiakim reigned in Judah from (609-597 BC).

Likely Historical Backdrop of Habakkuk (609-605 BC; 2 Kings 22-23)

- 609 BC Egyptian king kills Judean King Josiah
- **609-597 BC** Jehoiakim, a puppet king of Egypt, succeeds Josiah.
- **605 BC** King Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian empire win the Battle of Carchemish, establishing themselves as superpowers in the region.
- 603-601 BC-King Jehoiakim pays tribute to Babylon as a vassal king (until 600 BC)
- 597 BC Nebuchadnezzar lays siege to Jerusalem and deports king and elites to Babylon.
