
# A Word from One of Our Sponsors...

It is difficult for my children to really understand what life is like in Haiti and to feel some kind of connection to Wilna and Lichensky (our sponsored kids), so I'm always trying to find connection points.


One way we have done this is through the use of children's books. I knew our kids were going to have an opportunity to interact with Johny and Rosadite when they visited Glenwood last September. In preparation for that, I scoured the Fort Vancouver Regional Library system for every children's book they had about Haiti.

Here were a couple of our favorites:



#### "Running the Road to ABC" by Denize Lauture

This is a beautiful picture book that was particularly appropriate because it was about Haitian children running to school each morning. It captured the beauty of the outdoors around them and the joy of learning. I love books that introduce my kids to another culture through things we have in common – education, playfulness, and daily rhythms.



#### "Tap-Tap" by Karen Lynn Williams

This picture book is about a Haitian girl and her mama traveling to Market in rural Haiti. Like many children, this girl longs for something her mom can't give her, which in this case is a ride on the Tap-Tap (a common Haitian form of transportation). The story reveals how the girl helps her mom sell oranges, and in doing so, earns enough money to ride the Tap-Tap on the way home (by refusing other tempting treats). The rich watercolors, fine narration, and the picture of a child's life in Haiti filled our minds and our hearts.

- Eighty percent of Haitians live under the poverty line and 54% live in abject poverty. The average per capita income in Haiti is \$480 a year, compared to \$33,550 in the United States (2008).
- Because of both violence and AIDS, Haiti has the highest percentage of orphans of any country in the Western Hemisphere. Before the 2010 earthquake, the United Nations estimated there were 430,000 orphans.
- Haiti is the most mountainous nation in the Caribbean.
