An Open Door

There is a door in the wall.

Last year when Dave and I went to Haiti with a Global Outreach (GO) team, we saw the door closed. The community outside of the STEP Seminary campus, to which that door leads, known as Grand Ravine, was riddled with gang-initiated violence. The shooting of a seminary watchman is what closed the door.

While we were there, we built a house for a family in the community on the other side of the seminary. There have been over thirty houses built in that community. As the workers labored to provide physical shelter, the seminary students built relationships with the residents. People have, and are, coming to Christ. Although the sights and smells were shocking to me, they were also alive with hope. People in the community smiled and sang with us, they nodded when we talked about Jesus. You could see God's Spirit at work.

This year we ventured back to Haiti to help build a house with our four children. We had heard that the gang leader from Grand Ravine had approached Mason and asked him to begin building houses in that area. We rejoiced in this yet we were a little surprised when Mason told us we would be building on that side.

Remember the four children part of this story?

We flew into Haiti on Monday and began work on Tuesday morning. There were about fifteen Haitians working on the house, along with Mason and our family. Mason introduced us to everyone and said, "They look little but they're strong!"

The first thing we did was prove that statement inaccurate! We made a human chain to transfer the first 100 concrete blocks onto the foundation to begin the walls. The girls did not last the first round. Dave, along with Grant (14) and Rowan (10), spent the rest of the day hauling block and concrete and building concrete frames. Avonlea (16), Rose (9), and I spent time with the children. We played hand games and drew pictures. At night, we had dinner and hung out with Mason, Lauren, James, and Ashlyn. Their family is so hospitable and such a joy to be with.

The second day was more of the same. As we built relationships with the children, I was amazed at the difference between the

two sides of the seminary. The children in Grand Ravine knew none of the hymns I sang to engage them. When I talked about Jesus, they shook their heads in confusion. The door into Grand Ravine was open, but the darkness persisted.



Throughout the week, I noticed a change. We taught the kids a Teen Mission song called "Walking in the Light". We taught them "This Little Light of Mine". We played, laughed, sang, and worked. The seminary students walked around and talked to people, sharing the gospel in Creole. God's presence was tangible in that place. As we left that day the children held our hands and accompanied us out of the door while we all sang "Walking in the Light."

Thursday we went to Merger to see our sponsored children. We played on the playground with the two little ones. Our older student, Ricardo, took us to his home. We had a translator and were able to have a good conversation with him. Then we prayed for him just as we pray for him at home, only we were standing in his Haitian house. Dave and I prayed a benediction over him and we prayed God would raise him into a leader and a man of integrity.

When we went back to the seminary we were told that one person in Grand Ravine had responded to and accepted the gospel while we were in Merger.

God is moving everywhere in this world. He is moving in Haiti and He is moving here in Vancouver. He is moving when we open the doors that separate us from the things we are afraid of. He is moving even behind the closed doors, preparing hearts to respond to the ones who share the Good News. He is moving through His people, their prayers, their words, and their actions. He is moving in the hearts of adults, teens, and little children.

There is a door in the wall... And it is open. And the Light is pouring in. Praise God.

We are little but He is strong!
