TAKE-AWAY

A Gospel-centered parent recognizes that not only do their children need a Savior, under whose authority they must learn to bow their hearts, but they, as parents, need the Savior under whose authority they must bow their hearts.

They understand that God gives them authority as parents for the work of change, but that God has not granted them the power to make that change happen.

God gives us the privilege and authority shape our children for Jesus sake, keeping in mind that He has not given us the power to make those heart changes. Our responsibility is to shape their heart, God's is to change it.


Our behavior is influenced by:

- our core beliefs which are shaped by our culture, upbringing, temperament, Bible influence, etc. many of which we may not be aware we are influenced by
- our perceived and actual limitations

Ultimately, our actions/behavior reflect our deepest values and commitments. If our behavior doesn't line up with what we think we value, we have a gap (discrepancy) between what we say we value and what we do.

Ownership Parenting— is motivated by what parents want **for** their children and **from** their children. It is driven by a vision of what we want our children to be and what we want our children to give us in return.

Which of these things are driven by selfishness, fear, pride or arrogance?

- We work hard to control outcomes
- We don't want to be embarrassed by their behavior
- We want them to make us look good
- We want people to see us as a successful parents
- We desire respect and appreciation from them

WHERE IS YOUR TREASURE?
