DISCIPLESHIP QUESTIONS

- Take note of any observations, questions, and exciting insights you found while reading through the text to share with the group. What jumped out at you? What was something you noticed now that you didn't see before?
- What is the hardest thing about prayer? Is it difficult for you to pray? Why or why not?
- When do you usually pray? Share about what your prayer life looks like.
- Do you believe there is a right way or a wrong way to pray? Are there things you should not do when you pray? Explain.
- What does it mean to "be seen" when we pray? Does this mean we can never pray in public? How are we to pray according to what Jesus says?
- Take a look at verses 9-13. What do you notice about each line of the prayer?
- These last two verses (14–15) talk about forgiveness from our sins. What is Jesus talking about here? How is it that our heavenly Father forgives us when we forgive others?
- How might praying Jesus's prayer transform your prayer life?
 Where is the Spirit challenging you to pray differently?
