

THE RESSURECTED JESUS

LUKE 24:13-35

GETTING STARTED

• How did you celebrate Easter? Are there any special traditions you or your family do to celebrate the resurrection?

SCRIPTURE STUDY

Before you begin: Open with prayer and spend a minute or two in silence before God. Have multiple people ask the Holy Spirit to enter into your time together and illuminate your hearts and minds to scripture.

- Have someone read the passage aloud and note any observations, questions, and exciting insights you found while reading through the text to share with the group. What jumped out at you? What was something you noticed now that you didn't see before?
- What do you notice about the two men on the road to Emmaus? Try to imagine
 yourself as one of the disciples. What do you think is causing them to argue?
 Why does Luke make mention of their inability to "see" Jesus?
- How come Jesus takes the time to interpret the scriptures for the two men instead of just telling them who he is?
- What does Luke mean when he talks about Jesus being made known in the breaking of bread?

WRAPPING UP

• The disciples on the road to Emmaus, are moved from being hopeless to hopeful. For the church, the resurrection changes everything. Where do you see Jesus restoring your hope in this season? Where have you found yourself to be challenged and/or encouraged by God's grace?
