Questions for Reflection:

- 1. Consider how the Bible has been instrumental in helping you to understand who God is and what God has done. Spend a few minutes in prayer thanking God for His willingness to communicate and asking for His help to grow closer to Him through this class.
- 2. God's voice and God's presence are parallel ideas. Consider how this affects how you approach the Bible and respond to reading His Word.
- 3. When are you tempted to think that God is disinterested in communication with us? Why does this happen? How does what we learned today help us respond when God feels distant?
- 4. What is your heart's attitude towards the Bible and spending time reading it? What keeps you from reading it or from reading it in a way that is sincere and responsive? Do you have any roadblocks that you'd like to have this class address? Make sure to surface these at our next class.
- 5. Open your Bible to Psalm 119 and pick a short section (your Bible might have it divided up by Hebrew letter). Spend time praying through those verses and consider memorizing one verse that you carry with you throughout the week.
